GENERAL MANAGER'S REPORT

My first duty is to report that, as I write this introduction, our Chairman Dave Phillips has sadly been taken ill and is unlikely to return to office for some considerable time. We have been sending every best wish to him and his partner Nicky for a speedy recovery to full health and a return to Cricket with both us and with Brockhampton CC.

On a more pleasant note, the 2023 year proved to be a year of stability and steady growth. It was very early in the year when the ECB started issuing league tables for the growth of their national programmes in particular All Stars and Dynamos for kids aged 5-11. We took great pride and satisfaction from seeing Herefordshire pop to the top of the table for the rest of the year as our clubs signed up for a number of schemes and started to recruit new youngsters into the game. To see our name sitting among the Surreys and Yorkshires in terms of percentage growth was a pleasant sight for many in Herefordshire Cricket and something that everyone found motivating and exciting to see.

Of course, not long after that, those very same clubs stepped cautiously into the realms of the Worcestershire County Cricket league, some for the very first time. Apprehension led to confidence as the weeks unfolded, initially navigating the bad April weather to a summer of relative security and efficiency thanks to the good work of the WCCL Board and their chief administrator Stuart Lampitt. As the Summer progressed, clubs became comfortable in the weekly updates and news as well as their own performances. A process that was begun in November 2022 was bearing fruition and happiness. The Marches League will never be forgotten, of course, and may one day return but for now our embedding into the Worcestershire structure appears to have stabilised league cricket and our clubs.

On the back of this, there was a noticeable warmth and increasing confidence around the clubs to trust in the support of HCL and its staff. We ran a series of club engagement sessions where only two clubs failed to attend and quickly our number of affiliated clubs grew from 22 to 26, such was the re-birth of open age cricket across the county. These have been repeated this winter with seven further sessions and several one-to-one club visits, especially around the women's game and its growth. The new Indoor Women's League being a flagship for that buy-in.

In between all this we were busy in the daytime with our school's programme engaging three new coaches in to the Chance to Shine Programme and fleshing out our Champion Schools Programme (a paid for set of six visits to the school) - in all a comprehensive and coherent programme resulted in a series of match days and finals at Pentland Gardens to let kids see themselves perform with their friends and represent their schools. We also, of course, ran hand in hand with the HSCA in helping to deliver their comps across the county.

Stepping forward up the food chain are our representative junior teams who represented the county at seven age group levels in various competitions, including the ECB national competitions, and while our results are always going to be challenging due to the size of our county some individual performances across the season were heartwarming and can be seen on our sister website www.playcricket.com. Again, the sight of 42, mainly new, girls in our winter programme has been indicative of a lot of people's hard work.

The men's senior team suffered a difficult summer in the NCCA competitions and despite ramping up our off-field activities, including live streaming the games, we weren't able to consistently produce the required displays other than some fleeting exhibitions in the 50-over competition. Sadly, the team were relegated to Div 2 for 2024 and must fight their way back.

While concluding this opening note, it would be important to recognise that, like everyone, we are living in extremely challenging financial times and, as the 2024 AGM will reveal, our audited accounts will show a significant shortfall in revenues due to life's escalating costs. In short, we will be needing to diversify our revenue streams greatly in the coming months and years as the ECB's payouts will be flat-lined for the next four to five seasons. Our need for sponsorships has never been greater, so if you are reading this and care for Herefordshire Cricket and know someone to whom this would be of mutual interest, we have lots of branding and CSR opportunities that we want to share with budding investors. Please let us/me know.

Finally, my personal thanks to Dave as Chairman, a truly balanced and calm human being with a deep love for Herefordshire and Herefordshire Cricket who almost became an extra member of staff such was the time he gave to us, but also to all the Directors who share his love for Herefordshire and also give of their time knowledge and expertise for little or no reward. We would be much the poorer without you, but we would like others to step forward as nothing is forever. To the staff, both full and part time that work on behalf of the HCL, your know-how and flexibility in being able to turn your hand to so many things is unique. There are no one-trick ponies at Pentland Gardens, I can assure you of that, and if there are they don't last long.

In closing, we would also like to pay tribute to all our sponsors and investors as well as the many parents, friends, coaches, umpires, scorers, ground managers and volunteers who give so much from the goodness of their heart to cricket in Herefordshire. Without you all we would be lost, and the game would be in jeopardy. I am pleased to say we are indeed making good strides but there is much more work to go.

Women's and Girls Cricket 2024

This has been another year where we have seen great progress across the Women's and Girls' game in Herefordshire. We are about to start year three of our five-year development plan, and although there is still a lot of hard work to be done, we are on track against our targets and the future does seem bright. We were certainly a little behind the curve in terms of national progress, but the last two years have definitely seen us turn things around.

DEVELOPMENT:

In terms of development, we have seen some exciting breakthroughs. Our first ever women's indoor league has been the most exciting aspect of this. We have had four teams playing in the indoor league over the winter with Kington Comets becoming the inaugural champions! Brockhampton Ladies, Goodrich Panthers and Bartestree & Lugwardine were also involved.

It was fantastic to see the women have such a brilliant time and to see their techniques and match-play develop over the winter. As summer approaches the league will continue to expand with seven teams signed up at the time of writing.

We have also got six teams signed up so far for our new girls' softball league which will kick off with a launch night at Pentland Gardens on 16th May. This is another encouraging step forwards with creating opportunities for our girls to play a fun and fast brand of cricket.

In addition to this, Sue Watkins and I have been visiting each club to help them develop or begin their women's and girls' sections. This has been very successful in terms of supporting clubs with their structure and planning and we are already seeing excellent results.

Schools

We have been more visible than ever in terms of delivering Chance To Shine and our own Champion Schools programme in our primary schools. We have worked with more than 4,000 children in primary and provided staff Continuous Personal Development for dozens of teachers. We are also working with three secondary schools each year now and working with year 8 and 9 girls. They are receiving cricket coaching but also leadership training.

Secondary school cricket is the hot topic in cricket development currently and we are working hard to create more opportunities for secondary age children to play the game. It is important that we make sure that cricket once again becomes a core part of PE and games in Herefordshire schools for boys. We have been working closely with the Herefordshire Schools Cricket Association to provide boys with lots of competitions to compete in, but the next steps will be to ensure more regular delivery of cricket as part of the usual curriculum. We will endeavour to make sure that we are in line with the national changes here and reintroduce more competition and find more talent particularly in our state schools.

We have been collaborating with Kingstone High School and set up an after-school cricket club for the local primary schools. We have had four schools playing cricket over the last two terms and getting a first taste of the game. We are now aiming to replicate this pilot with Lady Hawkins and Wigmore High School to provide their local primaries with a similar opportunity. A special mention should go to Natasha Exley at Kingstone Academy and Dan Thomas at Kingstone High School for working so hard with us on this project.

2023 Season

The 2023 season was disrupted throughout the summer by very inclement weather playing a major part in a disappointing season with all formats affected.

We started off with the T20 competition, away at Sherborne school against Dorset, in game one, we lost the toss and batted first, nobody really got the measure of a spinning pitch and we were bowled out for 83. We bowled well, Alex Russell taking 3-9, but the total was reached in the final over.

The second game ended with the same result, Dorset scoring 130-4 and we were bowled out for 83; a difficult start to the season. The Devon fixture was called off on the Saturday morning of the bank holiday weekend, so we travelled down to Cornwall for the double header on the Monday.

Batting first in game one, we were restricted to 84-8, Cornwall reached their target in the 19th over for the loss of 6 wickets. We bounced back to register the first win of the season in game 2, scoring 126, Olly Walker with 44 being the main contributor, restricting the opposition to 122-9, Roshan Venkataraman 2-8 and James Rudge 2-27 doing the main of the damage. The two games against Wiltshire were abandoned without a ball being bowled, this meant that we did not qualify for the later stages of the competition.

The next round of games was in the 50 overs competition with Cumbria at Brockhampton the first challenge. In an extremely exciting game, we posted 227-9, Olly Rogoff top scoring with 87 and Roshan Venkataraman thrilling the crowd with 43 off 32 deliveries.

We started well, putting Cumbria under pressure from the start, at one point they were 60-4, but an excellent 5th wicket stand of 124 put the game back in Cumbria's favour. In a fantastic finish, we needed a wicket or restrict them to one run, while they required 2 runs of the last ball. Unfortunately for us, the ball got dispatched to the boundary, a one wicket loss but it is worth mentioning that Cumbria got to the final of the competition.

An extremely long trip to Northumberland followed, a disastrous day, Northumberland scoring 369-7 and bowling us out for 114! We bounced back well, defeating Lincolnshire by 2 wickets, Venkataraman picking up 5 wickets and Ben Chapman-Lilley scoring 47 in a measured run chase.

The final round was against Oxfordshire, chasing 259, we reached the target in the 48th over, Chapman-Lilley finishing on 98 not out and Matt Pardoe 57, but our narrow loss to Cumbria cost us a quarter final place.

The three-day format started with Oxfordshire at Eastnor. The game was rain-affected, with most of day two being washed out. The game ended in a draw with Conor Smith scoring 78 in the first innings and taking 3-38 in their 2nd innings, Sam Keeling-Wright also had an impressive game on debut, taking five wickets in the match.

The Cheshire game was completely washed out and the 'Showcase' game against Glamorgan was abandoned after 23 overs, with us being 93-4.

With two games left in the Championship, the pressure was on to get a result which would guarantee a place in Division 1 next season, but a disappointing second innings collapse cost us defeat against Berkshire, despite a fantastic bowling display from James Rudge, 5-57 in the first innings and 5-54 in the second. So, down to the magnificent ground of Sidmouth for the final game, Devon registered 377-9 in their first innings, an extremely impressive 154 from Elliot Hamilton being the highlight.

Ben Chapman-Lilley came close to matching that, with 118 and we were bowled out for 271, before Devon declared on 253-4, setting us 359 to win. Chapman-Lilley started well, but fell for 51, Conor Smith 56 and Roshan Venkataraman 68 gave us brief hope, but the huge total was too much at the end of the day, losing by 80 runs and the disappointing reality of relegation back into Division 2 in 2024.
