Richard Skyrme Steps Down from Herefordshire Cricket



HEREFORDSHIRE Cricket Ltd's Performance Manager Richard Skyrme has decided to step down from his role at the end of the 2024 cricket season. Skyrme, whose role included coaching the Herefordshire National Counties side, has been in post firstly on a part-time and then full-time role since 2018.

"It just feels like the right time to go," said Skyrme who will be 64 later this year. "And it's good to go out on a high after the National Counties side gained promotion back to NCCA Western Division 1 at the end of the season."

"Richard has been a key figure in cricket in Herefordshire for more than four decades," said Herefordshire Cricket's chairman Richard Prime. "He was an outstanding player throughout the 1980s and then became Herefordshire's first captain when we were elected to the Minor Counties Championship in 1992. We're

Rotherwood Healthcare is our front of shirt sponsor for the Men's 1st XI over 3 years – white and coloured kit – T20, 50 over and 3-day Cricket – 22 Days of Cricket live streamed across the country at our home and away matches. Kit is provided by **Fearnley Cricket**.

T20 – 3rd in the Group stages – lost in the semi-final play offs.

50 over – 4th in the Group stages

3 Day Cricket – Promoted from Western Division 2 to the top division – Western Division 1.

The investment allows us to keep the match costs for players to a minimum and support their winter coaching sessions at Malvern College as well as travel costs and hosting fees for the matches. Thank you Rotherwood Healthcare.



Blackfinch Group – Front of shirt sponsor for the County Age Group Boys and Girls programme – white and coloured kit – and Sleeve sponsor for the men's team (see above). Kit -**Fearnley Cricket**.

Girls matches – 20 matches (previously we played c3 per season!)

Boys matches – 79 matches completed in a weather affected season.

258 players pulled on the shirt for HCL in 2024 – 59 Female and 187 Male – in 2022 just 183 players pulled on the shirt of which only 21 were female players – this demonstrates the investment programme and its growth. From the EPP – 8 players are getting specialist coaching.

The growth of the Girls CAG programme has been a catalyst for Women's Cricket at Clubs – 6 now playing Softball compared to 2 years ago – one. The investment allows us to keep match costs for families down to 0 as well as provide 2 coaches per game, to work with the players.



Formus Pro - Sleeve sponsor for the County Age Group Boys and Girls programme – white and coloured kit. Kit is provided by Fearnley Cricket. As outlined above the growth in the Girls game has enabled us to spread the programme further. Our coaches have been out talent IDing and have 15 new girls attending training provided by our coaches who otherwise would not play cricket, 2 of whom have gone straight into the pathway programme. Our U11's have 17 on the pathway, U13's 15 and U15's 21.



GB Liners support our Coaching Camps and Holiday Schemes – 6 Camps a year delivered in the Holiday Periods for children aged 7-13 at St Marys School, Pentland Gardens and Wormelow CC. 6 Camps per year – 3 Days+ each camp depending on the time of the year. 14 -20 children per day who may otherwise not be introduced to Cricket. Two coaches per camp can now be employed to run the scheme as a result of the investment. 2024 – 25 investment means we may also be able to offer these camps to kids at Cricket Clubs around the county.
