- Manage and coordinate match details, selections, and tactical planning for your teams.
- Ensure effective communication between players and coaches.
- Actively scout and nurture young talent.
- You will report to the General Manager and the HCL Board Director (Performance)
- Establish a high quality and engaging programme of activities that allow cricketers to develop and be the best they can be.
- Coaching and leading the 1st XI Winter and Summer programme
- Coaching and leading the Development XI session winter programme
- Supporting and leading U18 fixtures where required
- Coaching and leading fixtures
- Attend pathway related meetings as and when required
- Report to the Performance Director at the Operational Group bi-monthly meetings
