HCL Chairman's Report

The last 12 months have been once again full of upheaval – mostly positive – and anyone who thinks that cricket is a slow-moving activity has clearly not spent any time in the Herefordshire Cricket office at Pentland Gardens.

Our hard-working staff, under the extraordinarily knowledgeable and enthusiastic leadership of Richard Cox, continue to thrive under the pressure of all of the many tasks which are thrust upon them.

Kirsty Sockett and Claire Langford have been fixtures in the office for some time and it's impossible to overstate how highly their abilities and commitment to cricket in the county are valued. It's the same with Pete Gale who has this year taken on some new and changed responsibilities with the arrival of two new members of staff, Kate Brazer and Ed McCabe, about whom you can read more elsewhere in this yearbook.

The two new arrivals are offset by one significant departure with the retirement of Richard Skyrme. Richard has been involved in some capacity with cricket in the county for more than 40 years and his place in our cricketing history is assured by being the first ever captain of Herefordshire County Cricket Club in 1992 and more latterly as a double-promotion-winning coach of our first team. And that does not even scratch the surface of his contribution as a player, player-developer, coach and administrator. He will be much missed but we will hope to see him as a welcome spectator at some of our matches this summer.

While there have been a number of changes in the office, there have also been some welcome additions to the board of directors which is now 10-strong. While we miss the dedicated expertise which Dave Phillips brought to the twin roles of chairman and finance director – and we wish him well in what looks like being a long road back from his very serious illness – we could hardly have been more fortunate in having Sue Watkins as a ready and willing replacement to take on the challenging role of balancing our books. Sue has slotted superbly well into her finance role which bolts on to her existing role as our women and girls director where, this season, as if she doesn't have enough on her plate, she is going to match-manage out new Tier Three women's team.

Tom Hall brings a wealth of contacts and knowledge to his role as our new Communities and Partnerships director while Kate Dawe's strong background in education makes her a perfect choice as our new schools director. Graham Andrews brings many years of service in sports management and administration to his role as our new EDI director while Helen Nenadich's knowledge and contacts will stand her in good stead as she looks for new sponsorship and fundraising opportunities.

Happily, we still have existing board members Jim Sandford, Roy Wargen and Susanna MacFarlane remaining in their roles and adding to the remarkable service and dedication they bring to the game in the county. Between board members and office staff, there's a connection of several hundred years with cricket in Herefordshire so please do not hesitate to draw on that expertise if there is anything you think that we can be of assistance with.

We have plenty of challenges ahead but we know that, with the ongoing support of our sponsors and volunteers, whether they be parents, friends, coaches, umpires, scorers or ground managers, for which we are immeasurably grateful, we can continue with the important work of ensuring that cricket plays a vital role within the sporting landscape in our county. The sale of the Hundred has brought considerable sums of money into the sport and a limited amount will trickle down to Herefordshire, but we know that our work locally will be equally important in our funding efforts upon which we shall continue to work diligently.

I wish you all well for the 2025 season and hope that, on and off the field, it brings all the success you hope for, as well as the chance to spend plenty of time with friends old and new.

NATIONAL COUNTIES FIRST XI REPORT

HEREFORDSHIRE will return to Division One of the NCCA Championship Western Section after gaining promotion back to the top flight following two years in Division Two.

And, as well as success in the longer form of the game, the county side continues to hold its own in the two shorter formats, too.

The first two games of the three-day campaign were, not unexpectedly in a soggy summer, drastically affected by wet weather. Both games were nowhere near a positive result when time was called although a century for Henry Cullen against Wiltshire and good batting from Nick Hammond, Ben Chapman-Lilley and James Rudge over the two games, as well as nine wickets in the match against Wales for Roshan Venkataraman, ensured that there was no lack of confidence going into the final two games when, finally, the sun began to shine.

At Wimborne, against Dorset, there was confirmation, if any was needed, that Matt Pardoe remains a hugely significant performer and surely one of the finest cricketers ever to turn out for Herefordshire. Pardoe's marathon 184, as part of a double-century opening stand with Taylor Cornall who contributed an impressive maiden county century, underpinned a massive first innings score.

Pardoe still retained the energy to snare four wickets in the Dorset second innings, as did James Rudge who ensured a memorable conclusion to the game as, with Herefordshire requiring only six to win in their own second innings, he deposited the first ball over mid-wicket for a massive maximum to win the game.

Herefordshire's batting strength was again hugely important in the final game against Shropshire at Eastnor where both sides went into the match seeking the win which would bring promotion. With local boy Luke Tulacz, vice-captain Nick Hammond, Chapman-Lilley and Cullen all contributing half-centuries, a first innings lead of more than 200 set Herefordshire in control. But Shropshire's Tom Fell, with a brilliant 154, pulled the visitors back into contention before Rudge, with an impressive and lengthy spell which brought four vital wickets, and Pardoe again joined forces to bring their reply to close. Even then, with a

relatively small target to chase, there were a few hiccups on the way before Pardoe's pivotal half-century proved enough to see Herefordshire across the line.

Earlier in the season, the powerful hitting of Ollie Walker, allied with useful cameos from Chapman-Lilley, Luke Powell and Jugar Johal and some miserly returns from Adam Hines and Venkataraman ensured a place in the T20 Super 12s and a long trip to Barrow-in-Furness, Victory against Lincolnshire in the first game raised hopes of progression which were swiftly dashed by defeat against a strong Cumbria outfit in the second match, ensuring that it was the hosts who progressed. Sadly, the tournament was never concluded as rain washed out the three days set aside for the finals.

Herefordshire reached the final 50-over competition group clash with a chance of progressing despite a crushing defeat by Norfolk in the first match of the season. An impressive victory over Staffordshire and a high-scoring defeat against Shropshire, in which some mighty hitting by Rudge in the closing stages substantially reduced the losing margin, followed to leave everything hanging on the final match with Suffolk at Colwall. Again, some more Walker brilliance brought hopes of a victory which would doubtless have been achieved had Herefordshire had the full 50 overs to chase down their target. But the net run-rate target meant that an earlier victory was necessary and wickets went down selflessly in the chase which ended just short of victory.

This year will bring fresh challenges without the colossal figure of Richard Skyrme at the coaching helm. But in Luke Sellers, we are confident that we have a new coach who can forge his own path and bring us further successes. County supporters will remember Luke as a player from 2008-2011 and he acknowledges the significant role that Herefordshire played in his own cricketing journey. Now he will look to bring the success he has achieved at club level with Cheltenham into National Counties cricket.

We wish him well.

FAREWELL

Since the production of our last handbook, we have, sadly, been notified of the death of Herefordshire County Cricket Club's first scorer Gordon Wood. Gordon was for some time Worcestershire's tannoy announcer at New Road but, as well as being a great cricket enthusiast, was also one of the most respected experts on Herefordshire railways about which he produced a number of books.

We also lost one of Almeley Cricket Club's longest standing members, John Mokler, a great supporter of all sport in the county and one of our original

life members.

Visits to Eastnor will no longer be the same with the passing of Rodney Jarrett, one of the famous gang of four, along with Jim Sandford, Dave Entwistle and the late John Taylor, who laid the foundations to make Eastnor the club it is today.

There were few greater enthusiasts for cricket in Herefordshire than Terry Mason, the driving force behind Herefordians for more than four decades and a great source of wisdom on cricket administration as well as the law.

While Roger Gibbons was best known for his association with Gloucestershire, where he was a former president and committee member in a connection which went back to 1950, he was a regular and enthusiastic follower of Herefordshire's fortunes and was almost always present at home games, unless Gloucestershire were also playing at home.

Luctonians lost one of their greatest servants with the death of Eric Lane, a member of the club for more than 50 years and head of the ground staff when the county side played at Kingsland on many occasions.

Phil Stock was one of the stalwarts of Canon Frome cricket for several decades and one of the leading lights of the Herefordshire indoor league during the 1970s and 80s.

We thank them all for their services to cricket over the years and offer our sympathy to their families and friends.

SCHOOLS CRICKET

We have worked with 51% of our primary schools this year with Chance To Shine and our own Champion Schools programmes proving to be a big hit with children and staff alike. We have worked with nearly 4,000 children in primary and provided staff Continuous Personal Development for teachers in all of the schools we have visited.
